Letter (President and Secretary,) Committee of Hungarian Churches and Societies of Montreal, *Canada* Expressing gratitude for resolutions passed by UN or Hungary and requesting UN to refuse credentials of the Hungarian delegation to the UN and to appoint a new committee for the Hungarian question.
- ✓ 10 28 Oct. Letter Diocesan Union of Holy Name Societies of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, L.I., N.Y. Suggesting a day of mourning be declared to commemorate the Hungarian uprising and the execution of ~~Imre~~ Imre Nagy and his associates.
