

Oder/Neisse

Despite the flurry of mentions of the Oder/Neisse boundry as a possible negotiation gambit within the context of the Berlin problem, the Polish regime has not reacted in any of the public media recorded here. The question is of course a touchy one since the regime is perfectly content to have at least one element of its relationship with the Soviet Union - the latter's all-out support for the border - which meets with the overwhelming approval of the Polish people unmarred by the participation of western powers in the guarantee of Poland's western borders.

Harvest

Immediately following yesterday's rather alarmist report on the progress of this year's harvest, Radio Warsaw now says that the gathering of crops has been resumed throughout Poland and that no serious damage has been done by the heavy rainfall of the last period.

A letter from the Eastern part of Poland to a relative in the West states that the grain harvest in this area has been exceptionally good. This latter report plus radio Warsaw's comment are in line with the previous optimistic reports on this year's harvest prospects in Poland.
