1. BULGARIA: THE FEW DETAILS PROVIDED SO FAR ON THE KOMSOMOL CONGRESS WHICH ENDED YESTERDAY SEEM TO BEAR OUT ANY ORIGINAL IMPRESSION OF NO SHIFT IN DIRECTION. THE OLD FIRST SECRETARY WAS RE-ELECTED.
2. CZECHOSLOVAKIA: GOOD PROGRAMMING MATERIAL IS PROVIDED BY THE STATEMENT OF MORE THAN 100 FRENCH INTELLECTUALS ON THE CZECHOSLOVAK SITUATION PUBLISHED IN LE MONDE OF SATURDAY.
3. HUNGARY: NOTHING.
4. POLAND: THE INFORMATION THUS FAR AVAILABLE ON NIXON'S PROGRAM IN WARSAW SEEMS TO INDICATE THAT OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE POLISH PUBLIC TO SEE THE PRESIDENT WILL BE LIMITED TO HIS LAYING A WREATH AT THE TOMB OF THE UNKNOWN SOLDIER AND A TOUR OF THE OLD TOWN. WHETHER HE WILL MEET CARDINAL WYSZYNSKI DURING THE CORPUS CHRISTI SERVICES IN THE CATHEDRAL OR ELSEWHERE REMAINS A MOOT POINT.
5. RUMANIA: THE RUMANIAN MEDIA ARE GIVING EXTENSIVE COVERAGE TO THE ALLEGEDLY ENTHUSIASTIC POPULAR RECEPTION OF CASTRO, QUITE IN CONTRAST TO THE BULGARIAN TREATMENT.
