Exploitation & Delivery QuotasTwo Trouble-Mongers At SLIVEN.SOURCE ISTANBUL: Letter from Bulgaria to a Turkish ethnic in Turkey.DATE OF OBSERVATION: 1951.

KADINOV Görgi, 35, married, of medium height, president of the SLIVEN Communist Party, was a Communist guerilla prior to 9 September 1944. He is considered a very powerful official among Communist circles and has a reputation of being a sadist.

PETKOV Dobri, 40, of medium height, married, mayor of SLIVEN, is an outstanding Communist. During August and September 1951, villagers near SLIVEN were forced to bring their "nared" to the municipality. PETKOV, thinking it would be good propaganda, met the villagers in front of the municipality with a band of musicians. Secret agents of the Security Organization disguised as peasants were carrying posters showing the slogan "we are proud to deliver our nared which will be used in feeding the working people of the whole world." The following prices were paid:

21 Leva for a kilo of wheat  
17 Leva for a kilo of rye  
14 Leva for a kilo of barley  
35 Leva for a kilo of beans.

The peasants were displeased with such low prices. A month later, PETKOV ordered all inhabitants of SLIVEN to deliver a certain amount of grain for the Korean children. Those who refused to obey the order were considered enemies of the Otechestven Front (Patriotic Front.) PETKOV and KADINOV began to visit the houses in person and collected the grain using the usual Communist terrorization methods. PETKOV Andon Kirov, an honest citizen told them he had no grain to give to other children, while his own sons were starving. The two Communists got mad and threatened him, saying he would soon go to a place where no food was needed if he insisted in opposing the decisions taken by the administration. Andon had a nervous break-down after the Communists left, and is still waiting for his unknown destiny.
