ANNIVERSARY--TRIBUTES

LONDON, OCT. 23-(REUTERS)--THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE BEGINNING OF LAST OCTOBER'S HUNGARIAN REVOLT AGAINST RUSSIAN DOMINATION WAS MARKED TODAY BY SIMPLE CEREMONIES IN MANY EUROPEAN CITIES AND TRIBUTES IN NEWSPAPERS TO THE HEROES OF THE UNSUCCESSFUL BID FOR FREEDOM.

A SMALL PARTY OF SOMEWHATLY-DRESSED HUNGARIAN REFUGEES PLACED A WREATH AT THE NATIONAL WAR MEMORIAL HERE, DEDICATED "TO THOSE WHO DIED FOR FREEDOM FROM THOSE WHO FIGHT FOR FREEDOM."

THE WREATH WAS LAID BY EIGHT MEN AND FOUR WOMEN, ALL OF WHOM TOOK PART IN THE REVOLUTION.

THE GROUP LATER WENT TO THE RUSSIAN EMBASSY AND PRIME MINISTER HAROLD MACMILLAN'S HEADQUARTERS TO PRESENT RESOLUTIONS CALLING FOR THE WITHDRAWAL OF RUSSIAN TROOPS FROM HUNGARY AND THE RESTORATION OF THE FUNDAMENT

GHTS OF THE HUNGARIAN PEOPLE.

IN PARIS, HUNDREDS OF HUNGARIAN EXILES WATCHED A CEREMONY RENAMING A STREET AFTER HLAJOS KOSSUTH, 19TH-CENTURY HUNGARIAN PATRIOT. MANY WEPT AS THEIR NATIONAL ANTHEM WAS PLAYED.

POLICE STOOD BY TO GUARD AGAINST ANY TROUBLE ON THE STREET, WHERE THE OFFICES OF THE FRENCH COMMUNIST PARTY ARE LOCATED.

ERIC LEM, PRESIDENT OF THE FEDERATION OF PARIS STUDENTS, AND OTHER STUDENT LEADERS PLACED SEVERAL WREATHS IN THE MAIN QUADRANGLE OF THE SORBONNE UNIVERSITY TO COMMEMORATE THE UPRISING.

SEVERAL PARIS MORNING NEWSPAPERS COMMENTED ON THE ANNIVERSARY BUT THE COMMUNIST PRESS CAREFULLY AVOIDED THE SUBJECT.

"THE IRON CURTAIN HAS CLOSED DOWN AGAIN ON HUNGARY," SAID CONSERVATIVE LE FIGARO. "THE SPIRIT (OF THE REVOLUTION) LIVES ON HOWEVER. IT HAS SHAKEN THE WORLD."

WEST GERMAN NEWSPAPERS ALSO RECALLED THE REVOLUTION, SOME IN ARTICLES WRITTEN BY ESCAPED REVOLUTIONARIES. IN VIENNA, SEVERAL NEWSPAPERS DISPLAYED BLACK BORDERS ON THEIR PAGES AS A SIGN OF MOURNING FOR THOSE WHO DIED IN THE REVOLT.

THE DANISH INDEPENDENT DAILY INFORMATION LOOKED BACK AT THE UPRISING AND BLAMED THE UNITED NATIONS AND ITS SECRETARY-GENERAL, DAG HAMMARSKJOLD, FOR FAILING TO DO THEIR DUTY DURING THE REVOLT.

"ONE MAN COULD HAVE HELPED AND DID NOT DO SO--DAG HAMMARSKJOLD, THE SECRETARY OF THE UNITED NATIONS, WHOSE PLACE IN THOSE DAYS AND NIGHTS SHOULD HAVE BEEN IN BUDAPEST AND IN NO OTHER PLACE IN THE WORLD," THE NEWSPAPER SAID.

"WE FEEL THAT IT HAS BECOME INCREASINGLY OBVIOUS THAT HE FAILED AS THE WHOLE UNITED NATIONS ORGANIZATION FAILED."
