RUMANIA: IN THE FULL TEXT OF CEAUSESCU'S SPEECH TO THE RUMANIAN-JAPANESE FRIENDSHIP MEETING IN BUCHAREST ON SEPTEMBER 1 WE HAVE FOUND AN INTERESTING PASSAGE: "WE CONSIDER THAT AN END MUST BE PUT TO ANY INTERFERENCE IN THE AFFAIRS OF OTHER PARTIES, THAT SUPPORT UNDER ANY FORM FOR ANY GROUP OF ANOTHER PARTY IS INADMISSABLE, THIS BEING IN CONTRADICTION TO MARXISM-LENINISM AND TO PROLETARIAN INTERNATIONALISM." THIS SEEMS TO REPRESENT PRIMARILY CRITICISM OF MOSCOW FOR SUPPORTING THE FACTIONAL RIVALS OF CEAUSESCU'S GUEST MIYAMOTO AND APPLIES ALSO TO SOVIET FACTIONALIST ACTIVITIES IN THE SPANISH, GREEK AND OTHER CPS. HOWEVER, IT CANNOT BE EXCLUDED--ALTHOUGH EVIDENCE IS LACKING--THAT CEAUSESCU WAS ALSO REFERRING TO SOVIET EFFORTS TO BUILD UP AN ANTI-CEAUSESCU FACTION IN THE RCP.
