

Health Delegation to Yugoslavia: A Hungarian public health delegation led by Dr. Gyula Vilmon, a Deputy Minister of Public Health, is in Belgrade to discuss joint measures against infectious diseases in the Hungarian-Yugoslav frontier zone. The Yugoslav delegation to the talks is led by Radomir Geric, member of the Federal Executive Council's Public Health Committee. (Budapest for Hungarians in W Europe 05.30, 14.11.57)

Yugoslav Metallurgical Delegation: A six-member Yugoslav metallurgical delegation arrived in Budapest on 12th November to study questions connected with co-operation between the two countries in the field of metallurgy. (Budapest for Hungarians in W Europe 19.00, 12.11.57)

Argentine Minister Leaves: The outgoing Argentine Minister to Hungary, Bartolome Daneri, left Budapest on 13th November. (MTI 13.11.57)

Journeys by Scientists: The Soviet biologist V. Gortumov is in Hungary for a study tour (MTI 13.11.57). Academician Alfred Renyi, a member of the Academy's Mathematics and Physics section, and Otto Benedikt, a corresponding member of the Academy's Technical Sciences Section, have left for the GDR. Professor Istvan Balint, the physiologist, has left for the USSR. Istvan Kovacs will lead the Hungarian delegation of physicists to the Jena conference on spectroscopy. Academician Jozsef Vercs has left for Leipzig by invitation of the German Mining and Metallurgical Association. (Budapest 12.00, 13.11.57)

Interview with Greek Charge d'Affaires: In a home service interview the new Greek Charge d'Affaires in Budapest, Zgourdaolis, referred to the resumption of diplomatic relations between the two countries and said that economic relations had been established as far back as 1953. The Greek Government had already displayed its interest in promoting cultural, scientific and sports relations with Hungary and he hoped that Greek writers, scientists and artists would in future pay more frequent visits to Hungary. The Wapping "War": Under the heading "Idyll in Wapping", Hungarians in Western Europe were told that a "war, enlivened with bloody brawls", had been going on in Wapping, "one of London's ill-famed dock districts", between local Teddy boys and Hungarian refugees.
