

MR. HAMMARSKJOLD IN STOCKHOLM

... Concerning the Bang-Jensen affair, Mr. Hammarskjöld stated that the case is now under investigation and his attitude will be dependent upon the result of the investigation. There is a question of a disciplinary problem of such a kind and importance as has never occurred before in the United Nations. Therefore, he (Mr. Hammarskjöld) cannot refer to any previous experience. Mr. Hammarskjöld stated that the problem for him of respecting the anonymity of the refugees was never questionable. During a short stop in Copenhagen, the Secretary-General stated that there is no possibility of forcing Bang-Jensen to give up the list of witnesses. But it is impossible from the United Nations point of view that the documents should be in the possession of the Danish Secretariat member and the responsibility should lie on the Secretary-General.
