The radio program "Choose a trade" does not take properly into consideration the principles of the second Five-Year Plan. The editors of this program perhaps do not properly appreciate the number of workers in the different branches who must be trained for technical development. Why, however, do they wish to arouse our sons' and daughters' interest first of all in commerce or small industry? Almost all of our factories struggle with a lack of tools. One of the reasons for this is that there are too few toolmakers. Nor are our foundries, our forging factories well of in regard to skilled workers. In both of these branches only 45% of the workers are skilled workmen.

In our second Five-Year Plan more foundries and forging factories are to be built and the machine and chemical industries are developing by leaps and bounds. We must now see to the training of many thousands of new skilled workers.
