

NEPSZABADSAG, 22 May 1957:

"The Central Statistical Office concluded the counting of dead and wounded during the counter-revolution. Contrary to countless untrue rumours, the report says:

In the armed fights which started on 23 October, 2700 Hungarian citizens lost their lives; 2195 deaths were registered, ^{and} the Statistical Office received information from the cemeteries, disinternment and statements about 307 deaths. It is estimated that about 100-150 deaths were not reported.

In the capital, 1,945 died in action, the largest number, 435, in the fights in the VIIIth district.

Between 23 October and 31 December 1956, the State Health Service treated around 20,000 persons who were wounded in action.

11,746 persons were treated in the hospitals; 7,210 in the ambulatory clinics, and 270 in the other health institutes. ^{In addition,} ~~Besides~~ ~~the~~ district and private doctors and the Red Cross ambulances treated several lightly wounded persons."
