1. BULGARIA: NOTHING.

2. CZECHOSLOVAKIA: RUDE PRAVO'S ARTICLE ON PRAGUE'S WILLINGNESS TO RESUME NEGOTIATIONS WITH WEST GERMANY IS NOT YET AVAILABLE IN FULL. ON THE BASIS OF THE EXCERPTS, THE GENERAL FEELING IS THAT IT DOES NOT CONTAIN ANY CHANGE IN THE CZECHOSLOVAK LINE CONCERNING THE ABROGATION OF THE MUNICH AGREEMENT AB INITIO. IT APPEARS RATHER AS A TACTICAL EFFORT TO BLAME THE FRG FOR THE STAGNATION OF THE BILATERAL TALKS.

3. HUNGARY: KADAR'S "UNOFFICIAL FRIENDLY" TALKS WITH HUSAK IN BRATISLAVA CAME TO AN END ON SUNDAY WITH THE PUBLICATION OF A LONG COMMUNIQUE TOUCHING ALMOST EVERY TOPICAL PROBLEM OF INTERNATIONAL LIFE. SPEAKING ON THE GERMAN QUESTION, THE DOCUMENT STATED: "IN THE INTEREST OF PEACE AND SECURITY IN EUROPE, IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT THE FRG SHOULD RECOGNIZE THE NULLITY OF THE MUNICH AGREEMENT AB INITIO." THIS DOES NOT SOUND LIKE A TOO RESOLUTE HUNGARIAN ENDORSEMENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK STAND ON MUNICH.

4. POLAND: FOREIGN MINISTER OLSZOWSKI IS LEAVING TODAY FOR AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO RUMANIA. THE MAIN TOPICS OF THE TALKS WITH HIS COUNTERPART IN BUCHAREST WILL BE THE DEEPENDING OF BILATERAL RELATIONS AND THE ORGANIZATION OF A EUROPEAN SECURITY CONFERENCE. AFTER BUCHAREST HE WILL PRESUMABLY GO ON TO SOFIA.
