Mr. Lodge gives no respite

" There was absolute order and peace in Hungary on the 23 October. Millions of working people continued in their creative and constructive work in the factories, shops, schools, offices and in organizations. It seems that this has caused pain to the U.S. Chief delegate in the U.N., Mr. Henry Cabot-Lodge. In a style customary of him he "remembered" the anniversary of the Hungarian counter-revolution. With his inciting outburst, bristling with distortions, he rudely interfered again in the internal life of the Hungarian people, trying to provoke trouble and disturbance.

The permanent representative of the Hungarian Peoples' Republic at the U.N. gave a deserved answer to the attack of the U.S. chief delegate, unprecedented in the coexistence of nations. The Hungarian delegation flatly and resolutely refused Mr. Cabot-Lodge's calumnies. He told in no uncertain terms that all efforts of the imperialists are futile and that they will not be able to prevent the consolidation of Hungary and ~~obstruct~~ the Hungarian people from continuing to build their free and independent country.

That Mr. Lodge and his associates have not learned their lesson from the history of the past twelve months does not alter the case in the least. It does only reflect a light on their political capacity and indifference for political realities. It shows that after so many fiascos they still cannot reconcile themselves to their definite and unalterable defeat.

It is comforting that the number of the followers of their "instructions" at home has shrunk today already into insignificance. "
