

### U.S.-HUNGARIAN RELATIONS

Washington, May 20 (UPI) - Deputy Assistant Secretary of State Roy Kohler today told off a Hungarian official for Hungary's "discourteous" treatment of a U.S. military attaché last month.

Kohler's remarks were directed to Tibor Zador, Chargé d'Affaires for the Hungarian Legation here.

Zador, who called on Kohler, told newsmen he discussed questions which, if solved, would contribute to "slowly-improving relations between our two countries". He said it was the policy of his Government to improve these relations.

State Department spokesman Lincoln White said Kohler then brought up the "discourteous treatment" given Col. J. G. Lemmon, U.S. Attaché, while traveling in Hungary last month. Lemmon was detained for 10 hours at Beregsurany without explanation.

White said Lemmon was accused later of having traveled in a restricted zone although there had been no prior official notification that the zone was restricted.
