(Summary and excerpts)

The author insists on the necessity of explaining international problems to the peasants as a permanent feature of propaganda work in the countryside. Unfortunately, the problem is still neglected. Certain comrades wrongly believe that the popularization of international problems is not necessary.

"Of course, such an attitude betrays a complete ignorance of the people and of the political situation. In a country where sharp class struggle still takes place, there is no such thing as an island which would be isolated from the enemy offensive and his methods. In DEBNICA too (in spite of its successes in collectivization, etc.), there are attempts at sowing confusion, undertaken by the Junkers and their allies who send revisionist letters to their former farmhands. The yapping stations still have listeners here."
