

TWO COUNTERREVOLUTIONARIES SENTENCED

(Text) The Supreme Court has sentenced to death Jozsef Nagy and Imre Farkas, armed counterrevolutionaries and former members of the national guard of Csepel, the murderers of Andras Bordas, Kossuth Prize holder and lathe worker. The sentence has been carried out.

3. Repressive Measures

Death Sentence handed down in Szeged (Associated Press)

Budapest, 12 March - A people's court at Szeged, in Southern Hungary, has handed down a death sentence against Jozsef Kovacs. He was accused of heading the Militia there during the 1956 anti-Russian revolt.

Nine others drew jail sentences of 2 to 15 years after a two-month trial that heard 160 witnesses.

The Communist newspaper Delmagyarország (Southern Hungary) reported the verdicts.

NEPSZABADSAG (March 11, 1958.) (official)

Sentence in the criminal case of two murderer-counter-revolutionaries.

During the days of the counter-revolution -Oct 26, 1956- Jozsef Nagy and Imre Farkas armed counter-revolutionaries enlisted in the services of the National Guard in Csepel and were searching after the daughter of Jozsef Kalamar who was Chairman of the Soviet in Csepel and who was murdered. They met on the street Andras Bordas, a Kossuth Prize winner and lathe worker who was walking on the street unsuspectingly, and they dashed off in pursuit of him. On Farkas' order the armed counter-revolutionaries encircled the house where Bordas took refuge and they forced the owner of the house to open the gate of the house. When they bursted into the ~~house~~ court-yard, Jozsef Nagy shot dead the fleeing Bordas.

The Supreme Court sentenced both men to death. The sentence has been carried out.
