1. BULGARIA: MANY DOMESTIC MEDIA COMMENTS ARE DEVOTED TO THE IN-  
CREASING PROBLEM OF DROUGHT, PARTICULARLY SERIOUS IN SOUTH-EAST  
BULGARIA. A CONFERENCE OF EUROPEAN AGRICULTURAL PARTIES WILL BE  
HELD IN SOFIA ON MAY 11-12; THERE IS NO EVIDENCE AVAILABLE  
CONCERNING WHETHER OR NOT LEGITIMATE WEST EUROPEAN PARTIES WILL  
PARTICIPATE IN THIS EXERCISE DESIGNED TO SUPPORT THE CALLING OF  
THE ESC, ALTHOUGH ONE MAY EXPECT AT LEAST THE FINNS TO APPEAR.
2. CZECHOSLOVAKIA: NOTHING.
3. HUNGARY: PREMIER FOCK GAVE A SECOND INTERVIEW CONCERNING HIS  
RECENT MOSCOW VISIT, THIS TIME TO RADIO BUDAPEST COMMENTATOR PAL  
IPPER ON APRIL 1. (DS) OUR IMPRESSION IS THAT THE SECOND  
INTERVIEW WAS DESIGNED TO PULL BACK FROM AND SMOOTH OVER SOME OF  
THE ABRASIVE STATEMENTS IN HIS BUDAPEST AIRPORT INTERVIEW.
4. POLAND: A POLISH GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN TOLD WESTERN NEWSMEN  
(AFP-REUTER - SENT DS) ON APRIL 1 THAT THE POLICE RAID ON A MAKE-  
SHIFT CHAPEL (CONDEMNED BY WYSZYNSKI) WAS JUSTIFIED BECAUSE THE  
BUILDING HAD BEEN ILLEGALLY CONSTRUCTED. THUS FAR WE HAVE SEEN NO  
REFERENCE TO THE CASE IN POLISH MEDIA BUT SHALL CONTINUE TO WATCH.  
WE BELIEVE THERE WAS A SIMILAR INCIDENT IN THIS TOWN (ZBROZA DUZA)  
IN 1969 AND THAT THE AUTHORITIES PROMISED PERMISSION TO BUILD A  
CHURCH BUT THAT SUBSEQUENTLY NOTHING HAPPENED. EERA IS CHECKING  
OUT THIS INFORMATION AND WILL ISSUE A BRIEF WRAP-UP IF  
APPROPRIATE.
