On November 10th, Geza NAGY, a kulak who owns 58 yokes of land, was summoned by the council leader and ordered to fulfil his plan relating to the sowing of bread grain. The kulak refused to fulfil his obligations and, shouting loudly, offended the council leader. His conduct was by no means unusual, the only noteworthy thing about it was that most people mumble silently instead of protesting loudly as he did.

Kulak Geza NAGY expressed his feeling not only in words, but also in deeds. He attacked the council leader, hit him in the face and then tried to trample on the representative of the State power. He attacked him several times before he was pushed out of the room. From the court-yard he dashed back knocked the telephone out of the council leader's hand and attacked him once more. Subsequently he also attacked the vice-president of the council.

Who was Geza NAGY ? In the days of old he played an important role in the village and after the liberation he was a leading member of the Small-holders' Party and became a village clerk.

He could do so as the Communist Party was still weak and poor peasants were not yet strong enough to take over power. Geza NAGY seems to have forgotten that all this is over now. He has been a faithful listener of Radio **FREE EUROPE** which broadcast the mean slanders of feudal gentlemen of the former regime. The ill-famed kulak is now behind the bars and waiting for a sentence to be passed on him by a court of the working people. (Summary).
