One Village's Disillusion.

SOURCE ATHENS: A Bulgarian peasant who escaped to Greece at the end of January 1952.

DATE OF OBSERVATION: January 1952

There are 25 families in the Bulgarian village of KAZAK, near IVALILOVGRAD. Before the war 23 of them were Communists. Today their disillusionment is manifest. Although no one dares to repudiate Communism or to give utterance to his change of heart, the former enthusiasm had disappeared and the disappointment in the regime is obvious.

EVAL. COMMENT: Matters confirmed by other sources, but the cited case is UNCONFIRMED.
