1. BULGARIA: NOTHING.

2. CZECHOSLOVAKIA: NOTHING.

3. HUNGARY: NOTHING.

4. POLAND: THE RECALL OF OLUBEK FROM SZCZECIN (SEE ITEM SENT DS) SHOULD, WE THINK, BE CONSTRUED AS A SIGN OF CONFIDENCE IN HIM. HE WAS SENT TO SZCZECIN AS A TROUBLE SHOOTER AND NOW, HIS MISSION ACCOMPLISHED, HE RETURNS TO PARTY HEADQUARTERS TO BECOME HEAD OF A CC DEPARTMENT (AS YET UNSPECIFIED). SINCE HIS JOB BEFORE HE WENT TO SZCZECIN WAS DEPUTY HEAD OF THE CC ORGANIZATION DEPARTMENT THIS MEANS A PROMOTION FOR HIM. THE NEW MAN BRYCH DOES NOT SEEM TO HAVE HAD PREVIOUS CONTACTS WITH SZCZECIN. HE WAS A PARTY SECRETARY IN RZESZOW FOR SIX YEARS AND HAS BEEN DEPUTY MINISTER OF THE MACHINE INDUSTRY SINCE SEPTEMBER 1969.

THE NATION WIDE CONFERENCE OF VOIVODSHIP FIRST PARTY SECRETARIES AND OF DISTRICT COMMITTEES (SEE ITEM SENT DS) WOULD SEEM TO BE THE KICK OFF OF THE PRE-CONGRESS CAMPAIGN. RE THE CONGRESS, THE BABIUCH PLENUM SPEECH INDICATED THE CONGRESS WOULD LAST FIVE DAYS AND THAT THE CONGRESS WOULD BE BROKEN UP INTO COMMISSIONS ON ONLY ONE OF THOSE DAYS.
