PARVAN Young Ionel, 24, a resident of BUCHAREST, 100 Unirii Street, was condemned to four years of forced labor on the Danube-Black Sea Canal.

At first the young prisoner was used for heavy labor on the canal, but as physically he was not strong enough to carry out this kind of work, he was punished with a transfer to the "disciplinary" brigade.

This brigade is commanded by a former criminal (NU), a gypsy, extremely cruel against the members of the brigade, so rightly called the "disciplinary" brigade.

As soon as young Ionel heard of his transfer he decided to do rather than join this brigade. It is assumed that he purposely approached the barbed wire fence of the camp with a view to be shot by militiamen. In fact, he was shot toward the end of July 1951.
