

### Plans of Writers

Edith Botond, in a talk on the current programme of writers and publishers, mentioned the following writers as engaged on literary work: Peter Veres, Jozsef Darvas and Laszlo Nemeth, the last named formerly "condemned to undeserved silence"; Lajos Kassak, "also relegated to the background in the recent past"; Jenoe J. Tersanszky and Aron Tamasi; Zseni Varnai, Kalman Sandor, Pal Szabo and Gyorgy Boeloeni, working on their "confessions"; Sandor Ridag, working on short stories dealing with the counter-revolution; and Laszlo Erdoes, writing about dissident refugees; Gyula Illyes, Albert Gyergyai, and Istvan Goeter.

"We must not forget the youngest generation of poets who grew up both as men and poets only after the liberation. They are worthy successors of the brilliant Hungarian poets of the past. Ferenc Juhasz and Laszlo Nagy, the best of this generation, will soon publish selected poems.
