Mrs. Stella CARABIBERIS, born in CONSTANTA on April 4 1902, and who came to Greece as a repatriate on February 19 1951 on passport No. 253/1950 issued by the Swiss Legation in BUCHAREST, has returned to CONSTANTA via ISTANBUL.

Mrs. CARABIBERIS's father Konstantinos CARABIBERIS was a landowner and businessman in CONSTANTA /note: subject's married and maiden names are the same./ In 1921 she married Alexander who owned a large shoe store in CONSTANTA. He was killed in an automobile accident in 1946.

Subject has two children: a son Constantine, born 1923, who studied medicine in BUCHAREST, married a Rumanian woman, also a doctor, now lives in CONSTANTA and has two children; a daughter Sophia, born 1922, married to a Greek Cleanthes DALIDAKIS, lives in ATHENS, has two children.

Since arriving in Greece Mrs. CARABIBERIS reportedly

was unable to find employment of any kind and since her son-in-law was not in a position to help her, she lived at the Refugee Camp in PSYCHIKO. She left ATHENS, according to her daughter, around the end of January and stayed in ISTANBUL until sometime in March, when she left for Rumania. Daughter said she had had a very brief letter from her mother merely stating that she had traveled by boat from ISTANBUL to CONSTANTIA and had arrived safely, but giving no further details.
