

Radio Bucharest attacks an RFE program according to which "five million jobless in the USA have attained happiness and life." The RFE program allegedly pointed out that American workers receive more salary when unemployed than Romanian workers while employed. In order to combat this impression, the Radio Bucharest broadcast quoted workers in the mining center of Morgantown on May 31 as having told listeners of starving children asking for bread, jobless workers looking for something to eat from a trash pail and others sleeping at night in the open air. The broadcast quoted a Romanian who formerly lived in the S US as having said that he vividly remembered days such as those in Chicago and Morgantown.

In a reference to Captive Nations Week, Radio Bucharest also attacked the US for intensifying the bankrupt cold war by a new provoking campaign versus the socialist camp. "The recent USA Congress resolution and Eisenhower statement concerning the organization of a week of hostile manifestations against the socialist countries are meant to worsen the international tension and to create difficulties for the current negotiations for a positive solution of some problems which are vital for security and peace of all peoples, including the Americans."
