6) Trade with the Outer Seven, Other European Countries, and Developed Non-European Countries

Highlights of Tables IV, V, and VI, below, are the decrease in trade with the US; the doubling of trade with Israel; the sharp increase in trade with Spain and Japan; and the low level of trade with Canada. The latter figure is expected to rise, however, after the visit of Deputy Premier Draganescu to Canada. It should also be noted that Rumanian trade with Switzerland resulted in a 4.8 m.l. deficit in 1967, compared with an export surplus of 20 m.l. in 1966.
