TeachersTurkish Communists in RUSE.SOURCE ISTANBUL: Turkish emigrants from Bulgaria, all from the RUSE districtDATE OF OBSERVATION: 1951

(LNU) Niyazi, a schoolteacher from KOSANA near RUSE, spread the Communist doctrine among his students. Zulkar (LNU), a member of the Communist Party since 1944, also taught at the same school. These two teachers gave strict orders to the students not to attend religious instruction. Similarly a young teacher IBRAHIMOVA Remziye, daughter of Ibrahim, advocated that STALIN was God.

MUHAMMAD Ismail, the president of the Turkish Moslem Society, is a native of RUSE living in SOFIA from where he directs his Communist activities. MUHAMMAD is a Communist of long standing and was in prison for his ideas previous to 1944. His wife, Vechiye, also a fervent Communist, visited the Turkish Consulate at STALIN (ex-VARNA,) and tried to persuade the consular authorities not to deliver any more emigration visas because most of the applicants were gypsies trying to infiltrate into Turkey. BILAL, from SINANKOY, a member of the "Bulgarian-Russian Society" is the official orator of the Communist Party in RUSE.

(LNU) Dzavit, who was a newspaperman in Turkey before he fled to Bulgaria to express his Communist ideas, is giving lectures depicting Turkey as a dictatorial, Fascist country, trying to dissuade ethnic Turks from emigrating to Turkey. Dzavit gives public lectures at the "Gradski naroden savet" (public town-hall.)

(LNU) Raif, from SINANKOY, is an active propaganda agent who is trying to indoctrinate the Turkish population in and around RUSE.

CHESHMEZHI Huseyin, the editor of the Communist youth paper "Septemvricha" (Septemberist) is also from RUSE, though living in SOFIA, and is actively working with the Communist.
