Universities

In the new university year, 1951/52, new faculties of "principles of Marxism-Leninism" were established in nearly all academic schools in Poland, and their attendance is compulsory.

They were established at the Central School of Planning and Statistics in WARSAW, at Central School of Foreign Service in WARSAW, at Higher School of Economics in CRACOW, POZNAN, KATOWICE, LODZ, WROCLAW, and CZESTOCHOWA, at Central School of Agriculture in WARSAW, at Higher Schools of Agriculture in OLSZTYN, with the departments of the Polytechnic Schools in WARSAW, LODZ, WROCLAW, GDANSK and Silesia (in GLIWICE,) at Higher School of Maritime Commerce in GDYNIA, at the Marie Curie Sklodowska University in LUBLIN and at the Universities of LODZ, POZNAN, WROCLAW, Jagiellonian University in CRACOW and Nikolaï Kopernik's University in TORUN.

Some other lectures of a distinctly political character were introduced. Lectures on the "Economics of Socialist Agricultural Enterprises" (kolkhozes and sovkhoses) were created with agricultural faculties of the POZNAN, Jagiellonian (CRACOW) and M. Curie Sklodowska's (LUBLIN) Universities and with the Central School of Agriculture in WARSAW.

At the faculties of humanistic sciences of the WARSAW, CRACOW and POZNAN universities, studies of "history of material culture" were organized. At the humanistic faculty of the WARSAW University, lectures of Russian literature and Russian language were introduced.
