

Memorials Unveiled

A monument to Hungarian and Soviet victims of the fighting against the counter-revolution last October and November was unveiled in Miskolc on 3rd November, reported the Home Service. A mass meeting was addressed by Jozsef Erieszol, First Secretary of the County Board Committee of the Hungarian Socialist Workers' Party; M.D. Boytsev, Counsellor at the Soviet Embassy in Budapest; and Karl Schirdewan, member of the visiting GDR parliamentary delegation. No details of the speeches have been monitored here. (Budapest 23.00, 3.11.57)

A memorial plaque was unveiled at the Budapest police headquarters on 2nd November, in memory of policemen who died in the counter-revolution. Col. of the Police Gergely Sos, Budapest Chief of Police, made a speech. (Budapest 21.00, 2.11.57)

More Provincial Liberation Anniversary Celebrations: A Lenin statue was unveiled in Cegled on 3rd November to mark the anniversary of the town's liberation. A speech was made by Lajos Feher, member of the Party Politburo. On the same day a liberation anniversary celebration in Szolnok was attended by representatives of the Soviet troops stationed there. Participants of the meeting sent a telegram of greeting to the Soviet Command in Hungary and to Premier Kadar. (Budapest 19.00, 3.11.57)

Nyiregyhaza Liberation Anniversary: The celebration of the 13th anniversary of the liberation of the town of Nyiregyhaza was attended by several of the Soviet soldiers who helped to take the town. Wreaths were laid by local workers on the Soviet and Rumanian war memorials. (Budapest 23.00, 30.10.57)
